



Information for occupational therapists about Welsh Approved Clinician key competencies and legislation.

England has eight competency areas in the Multi-professional Approved Clinician Framework (from HEE 2020).

Wales, however, has nine competency areas as laid out in Schedule 2 of the Approved Clinician (Wales) Directions 2018.

The relationship and differences between the two sets of competencies' is shown below.
