

Medicines Mechanisms Email Network

Statement:

RCOT has been providing guidance and advice to members for many years on the role of medicines within practice, and developed a variety of member <u>resources</u>. RCOT continues to promote the use of medicine mechanisms in all levels or practice, using patient specific direction or <u>patient group directions</u>.

With an increasing number of members training and working at advanced levels of practice over the last few years, it has become clear that the inability to prescribe is presenting barriers to service delivery, patient care and to progression of occupational therapists' careers.

The College is committed to developing a case of need for increased responsibilities regarding medicines mechanisms for occupational therapists at advancing levels of practice. Given the wide range of areas in which occupational therapists work, the Royal College believes that there are many areas where increased medicines responsibilities will facilitate the delivery of a more personalised approach to care.

Medicines Mechanisms_network purpose:

The aim of the network is to update group members with relevant information, news and events related to RCOT's work in this area. As part of this group you will be invited to support the case for increasing and extending occupational therapists use of medicines mechanisms.
