

The development of the Toolkit Living well through activity in care homes

Aim

- To develop a resource offering practical ideas and advice to support meaningful activity for older people in care homes, inclusive of everyone regardless of their gender, sexuality, ethnicity and cultural background.
- To include a range of materials to meet the diverse needs of the target audiences, including residents, their family and friends; care home managers and staff; and occupational therapists.
- To provide templates and audit tools for care home managers and staff to review and evidence the quality of life and wellbeing of residents.
- To support the shift in culture required in many care homes for them to meet the relevant standards related to activities of daily living, choice and care planning.
- To explain how to capture the experience of residents through person-centred outcomes.
